NONPROFIT NEWS

MAJOR MILESTONES

At its annual meeting with boards of directors and trustees, the **Arkansas Museum of Fine Arts** announced a slew of achievements and goals to cap the museum's first year. Key takeaways include the return of the museum's famed Tabriz gala in 2025, an upcoming Diego Rivera exhibit, the presentation of the Winthrop Rockefeller Memorial Award to Van Tilbury and a final tally of the AMFA's capital campaign that raised \$176.6 million, far exceeding its goal of \$66 million.



Restore Hope, an Arkansas-based nonprofit assisting families in crisis, announced its 100 Families Initiative model will be adopted by communities in Michigan and Canada. The model has been implemented across 16 counties in Arkansas and connects resources via one software hub to better "serve a family holistically."

"Families in crisis have many needs, like help with food, housing, transportation, substance abuse treatment, child care or access to mental health services. A single organization can not help a family with all of those," Restore Hope Executive Director Paul Chapman says. "The software allows providers to communicate efficiently about the various needs of a family and see who all is able to assist them. This way providers are not working in silos and services are not being duplicated."



HIGH PRAISE

Camp Aldersgate is now the first Heart-SAFE Project ADAM Designated Camp in the country, a designation requiring the necessary tools and training to respond to cardiac emergencies quickly and effectively.

The **Women's Foundation of Arkansas** announced its 2024 Power of the Purse honorees: Dr. Nirvana Manning as Woman of the Year in Public Service, Lenore Trammell as Woman of the Year in Business and Cathy Tuggle as Woman of the Year in Philanthropy.

The **Argenta Contemporary Theatre** is teaming up with Celebrity Attractions to host the inaugural Broadway Bound Awards highlighting high school musical theater and wrapping with a "one-night-only special showcase event" next spring. Winners will advance to the National High School Musical Theatre Awards in New York City next summer.



NEW DIGS

Refuge Village, the city and partnering organizations recently broke ground on Providence Park, a housing initiative in southwest Little Rock utilizing sustainable tiny homes and a deep connection to community in hopes of providing a permanent solution to chronic homelessness.

Seis Puentes, a nonprofit empowering the Latino community in central Arkansas, will officially open its new headquarters in North Little Rock on July 31.

Habitat for Humanity of Central Arkansas has announced a new ReStore location coming to the Colony West Shopping Center in Little Rock. ReStores sell discounted new and gently-used furniture, appliances and building supplies with proceeds going to the nonprofit.







Ten distinctive and delicious restaurants and bars are located inside the hotel including Henry's Palm Beach showcasing elevated comfort food; Echo, which blends bold, unique flavors in an urban space; and HMF, which is situated in the Florentine Room serving up a globally influenced menu, an extensive wine list and original cocktails.

As a guest, one must-have experience is to put on your Sunday best and dine at The Circle. The Old World architectural gem serves up a mouthwatering breakfast each morning, while a superb brunch takes over The Circle's elaborate spread on Sundays. The local burger scene is keeping customers fed, full and hungry for more.

ORIGINAL SMASHED 'N' STACKED

July is cookout season, and on every grill in America this summer, one comfort food will always be there: burgers. Popular for its versatility and endless array of add-ons, the burger can be found at picnics, pool parties and ballgames all summer long. To find out what takes a burger to the next level, *Soirée* consulted three burger pros in the Little Rock metro who continually bring the heat and unique local flavor.

Smashed 'N' Stacked

Smashed 'N' Stacked co-owner Brannon Racop says burgers were a natural choice for his food truck.

"They're universally loved, customizable and perfect for on-the-go eating," Racop says. "Plus, there's endless room for creativity with burger toppings and flavor combinations, which lets us put our own spin on this classic food."

According to Racop, the key is high-quality ingredients.

"Our secret weapon is perfectly seasoned, juicy patties," he says. "We don't skimp on flavor, either. We handcraft our sauces in house using unique blends of herbs and spices."

The truck, which can be found most days in Pettaway Square, has a clear bestseller. Its namesake burger features a "bacon bit smashed patty" topped with a shredded cheese blend and their signature sauce, which co-owner James Mann describes as a take on barbecue sauce with a honey mustard base.

Kent Wulf eats at the food truck weekly. While he loves their burgers, the heart and mission of the business are what keep him coming back.

"James spends a lot of time in the community feeding people when he could be making money," Wulf says. "That's not a decision many people choose to make, but he does. And for [my husband and me], that makes the burgers taste even better."

Smashed 'N' Stacked's "More Than a Burger" campaign features an exclusive item each month where a portion of proceeds go to a local nonprofit serving people in need. The evolving menu gives them a chance to get creative, such as with June's Mediterraneaninspired offering, while keeping customers coming back and donations coming in.

"This isn't just about selling burgers for us," Mann says. "We love our community and the people in it."

Brood & Barley

"It starts with the grind," says Jess McMullen, co-owner of Brood & Barley, and he means that literally.

The Argenta restaurant uses a proprietary beef blend for its burgers — "Fat ratio matters." — as well as high-quality bison for its umami burgers, plus a distinct blend of toppings, condiments, sauces and spices.

"What truly makes a great burger is the balance between the entire creation," McMullen says.

Each month, the Brood & Barley staff competes for the esteemed honor of creating the next "Big Stupid Burger," a monthly special with a cult-like following. Recent favorites include June's The Hulk with pork belly, green chilis, fried avocado, mixed greens and a green goddess sauce; and April's Big Stupid Bulgogi, which boasted house kimchi, Korean braised beef short rib and bulgogi sauce. July's offering showcases local peaches, Tajín Seasoning and a bruleed bun.

On its main menu, the restaurant offers six different smash burgers for the lunch crowd and hosts happy hour Monday through Saturday. McMullen's current favorite is the Yum Yum Burger, complete with American cheese, pickles, house-made yum yum sauce, red onions and a brioche bun.

"Brood & Barley has happy hour figured out," returning diner Juli Summitt says. "We always come back for the duck wings, and we can't leave without getting the 'Soprano Smash Burger.' All around, it's a great culinary experience."

Copper Grill

"The approach we take is simple," Copper Grill Owner Dan Kovach says.

The downtown restaurant has perfected the elevated burger its diners crave: a beef blend of chuck and brisket, an in-house seasoning blend and two four-ounce patties on a char grill. According to Kovach, most customer feedback revolves around how flavorful, juicy and expertly seasoned the burgers are.

One of the most notable elements of a Copper Grill burger is the bread it sits on, a custom brioche bun created by Community Bakery.

"The brioche bun is a hit," Kovach says. "It looks big, but presses down perfectly."

The signature sweet sot burger is their bestseller, topped with bacon jam, sweet hot millionaire's bacon, sriracha aioli, housemade pimento cheese and arugula.

Regular customer Pattie Davidson has lived above the restaurant since 2015 and appreciates the environment Kovach and his team have created.

"The food is always delicious, and the staff and patrons are all so friendly," Davidson says. "In the warm weather months, Dan has created a very welcoming patio space. There's no place like it downtown."

"The burger is an American classic because it's a food item that brings people together," Kovach says. "Everyone has a fond memory of their favorite burger or has debated what restaurant makes the best burger. Copper Grill strives to be a consistently excellent choice in the Little Rock dining scene, sourcing the best ingredients being produced by an amazing team of people."

Green is More on Fillmore

Go inside a Heights home designed with Mother Nature in mind.

HEN BRAD AND Kathy Workman decided to build a home in a historic neighborhood, they knew two things for sure: It would be as environmentally friendly as possible, and Brad's career in architecture would help bring it to life.

Brad called on his old friend Keith Wingfield, managing member of River Rock Builders and a specialist in green and environmental design, and with realtor Brandy Harp's help securing a property, the team set out to construct a new, green residence in The Heights.

And although life has since drawn the Workmans away from the capital city, what now stands on North Fillmore Street is a home in harmony with its habitat and inhabitants. *Soirée* sat down with the couple and Wingfield to learn more.

Brad, how did your background in architecture, particularly in integrated practice, influence how you approached a project so personal?

Brad: I was a young registered architect when a recession occurred. That motivated me to return to college and pursue a degree in computer science. The majority of my career has been in the CAD (computer-aided design) and BIM (building

information modeling) industry where I initially wrote software for architects and engineers and later became an executive in a CAD/BIM international company. I applied BIM during the design and documentation process. Integrated practice meant I involved the contractor (River Rock Builders) during the design process to get their input before the design was finalized.

Why was it important to you for your home to be energy and environmentally friendly?

Brad + *Kathy:* We wanted to be good stewards of the planet. Therefore, we made this home a high-performance, net-zero house. We applied many of the "passive house principles." This house is one of the [most air-tight] houses in Arkansas. ... Of course, you need fresh air in the house, and we achieved this with a ventilation system that filters and dehumidifies the outside while recovering heat or cooling.

As one of a few "green" builders in the area, what are some of the notable ways this house meets those standards?

Keith: The most critical methodology for green building is to reduce the overall demand for energy, either electricity or natural gas.









This is done by creating a better "building envelope" for the entire home, reducing the air leaks in or out of the home while still bringing in the fresh air necessary for any new home to be healthy and environmentally clean. We used both open cell and closed cell foam to help accomplish this with a key focus on where and how to apply the foam. Foam is not a cure-all, and if used improperly can cause greater harm than good. We've trained on all the aspects of energy efficiency and green building to bring high performance to each home we built. Finally, the use of a small amount of solar panels takes care of the rest of the equation for green building by providing electricity for the small amount of energy required for this high-performance home.

What are some elements you'd never know are green, or better yet, perform better than their traditional counterparts?

Brad + *Kathy:* Desiring to apply the passive house

principles meant the house had to be all-electric and energy efficient. We discovered that induction cooktops are up to 10% more energy efficient than conventional electric stoves. Additionally, we discovered a heat pump hot water tank consumes up to 60% of what a standard electric hot water tank consumes.

What did you learn from this project that you'll take with you going forward?

Keith: We used the electric hybrid heat pump water heater for the first time, and it seemed to perform very well. I hope to be able to compare its performance with the tankless natural gas water heaters that we normally use.

What green home trends do you think will stick around for the long haul?

Keith: Builders must begin to use fresh air systems to introduce clean air into the home at a temperature that can be tolerated. Our technology tempers the air to a usable range so that we are not introducing hot or cold air into the home, rather we put air that is near normal temperature and heat or cool it to bring it to the set temperature of the HVAC system. This is a must for a healthy home.

What are some ways you were able to blend fun and function on the property?

Brad + *Kathy:* We like to swim for exercise, and the pool heat pump powered by solar panels allowed us to extend the swimming season considerably. With the recent tornado activity, we also decided to build a FEMA F5-rated shelter inside the house. We insulated it and added a cooler, allowing it to become a dual-purpose wine cellar/ storm shelter.

What is your favorite feature of the Fillmore home as a contractor?

Keith: The outdoor area with the pool wrapped by the U-shaped house and accessory garage building, along with the spacious rear patio, outdoor kitchen and invisible electric screens make this area a must-use place for any homeowner. In addition, I think the eyebrow front porch roof made of copper is a unique architectural element that fits The Heights Historic District very well. My compliments to Brad on this feature.

What advice would you give to first-time home builders?

Brad + *Kathy:* Have patience with the subcontractors. We would also tell them not to be afraid to step out of their comfort zone when building their home. In the past, we leaned toward modern designs. With this house, we felt it should honor and fit in with the older homes in The Heights, so we settled on a modern Craftsman style with the eyebrow entry roof.

s the summer months continually beckon us outdoors, they also invite us to reimagine our outdoor living spaces, rethinking every green and paved square inch until it fits our open air dreams.

That's when people come to see Megan Thomas. Thomas is the co-owner of Ninth and Co., an outdoor-centric retail shop and showroom located in The Promenade at Chenal. The business is an offshoot of Antique Brick & Block, a building materials store her father opened in the 1970s. In 2005, Thomas joined the family business at the same time it began offering outdoor furniture and accessories, an expansion that became known as Antique Brick Outdoors.

After nearly 20 years of growth on Ninth Street downtown, that expansion evolved again in 2023 into its current rebranded space on the other side of the city, and with a name that pays homage to its beloved Hanger Hill home.

Soirée sat down with Thomas to talk Ninth and Co., this year's outdoor trends and why shopping local always pays more in the end.

As Ninth and Co. operates under the Antique Brick umbrella, can you tell us how the two work together and what their key differences are?

MT: Antique Brick & Block offers all masonry-related building materials. Starting with the basic building blocks in the foundation of a home — the brick and stone veneers that often are the most daunting decisions for a homeowner --- to the finished hardscapes of a patio and pool deck, we carry every element, even manufacturing many of the concrete-based items at our downtown Little Rock facility. Ultimately, Antique Brick & Block offers all of the permanent features of a home.

Ninth and Co. offers all the outdoor furnishings to complement the outdoors from dining to lounge spaces, fire pits and pool chaises, even art and accessories for the interior. In our previous location downtown, Ninth and Co. was more of a destination center with limited hours, but our move to west Little Rock has allowed us to expand our hours, offering a true retail shopping experience including weekend hours.

Both companies cater to both commercial and residential spaces and are characterized by a wonderful team of people focused on the customer experience from the initial design phases all the way through delivery and installation.

When customers come to Ninth and Co., what are some of the most common problems they're trying to solve?

MT: At times, budgets run out by the end of a project and little is left for outdoor spaces. While the outdoor furnishings we offer are high-end and can sometimes be pricey, we love the challenge of a budget. Additionally, space planning is a common challenge. Homeowners often want to include both dining and lounge spaces, and that's not always feasible without crowding out a space. So we work hard to incorporate non-traditional seating areas - arranging ottomans as coffee tables or selecting decorative stools or poufs that serve as both end tables or additional seating — depending on the need. We also see a lot of customers who just need replacement cushions or could benefit from covers that help prolong the life of their outdoor furnishings.

Of all the services you offer, which is the most underrated?

MT: Our free white-glove delivery service and in-home design consultations, including space planning. It's true (and unfortunate) that many of the products we offer can be purchased online directly from the manufacturer, and sometimes with free shipping. However, many of those items come in a box requiring assembly and boxes that need to be disposed of, and there are often damaged items and warranty claims that come from that. We take care of 100% of those headaches, and often for less than what is offered online.



When someone is rethinking an outdoor space, what questions should they ask?

MT: When thinking of your outdoor space, it's important to consider how you'll spend your time. Do you enjoy dining outside? Or do you prefer to lounge and enjoy cocktails? If it's truly dining, how many people do you plan to seat on a regular basis? A very important and often overlooked question is how much maintenance and upkeep you are committed to doing.

What popular new trends are you seeing this year?

MT: Sustainable outdoor furniture has become a cornerstone of outdoor living. Many of our products are manufactured with recycled ocean plastics, including the weaves. Even the fabrics are now produced with a minimum of 20% recycled content. Not only does this furniture have a great sustainability story, but it is virtually indestructible and amazingly lowmaintenance.

Likewise, what classic elements do you think stand the test of time?

MT: While there has been a shift toward modern design and mid-century styles, the reality is that we are still in the South, and that Southern living charm still commands for many buyers. Teak and wicker are classic elements that we will continue to see in outdoor living designs.

How the Argenta Contemporary Theatre built a cultural haven, and how Vincent Insalaco built the Argenta Contemporary Theatre.

S A POLITICAL fixture in the 1970s, Vincent Insalaco can fill stories of Arkansas' political history with living, breathing characters. Or he can help you understand the obvious, but not immediately apparent, connection between the video rental business, independent film and the straight-tostreamer options we enjoy today.

To date, his 70 years have been anchored by not just one, but several fulfilling careers, a lasting and influential love story and a deeply rooted community. It's a compelling narrative, to the point that even Insalaco, at times, feels his life has been too perfectly scripted to be his own. So it seems fitting the thread he can always pick out between his many chapters is the importance of story, performance and the meaningful connections that form on both sides of the stage.

In some ways, his journey to cofounding the Argenta Contemporary Theatre (ACT), originally the Argenta Community Theater, and holding his current position as producing artistic director started with a lonely childhood in New York. As a kid in the 1950s, he developed a years-long case of rheumatic fever. He was often bed-bound, so instead of playing sports like his brothers, he turned to reading and music. He credits his arts-focused interests with setting his path to the theater. And it's why to this day, while always quick to defend sports, Insalaco equates the significance of the stage to the discipline required on the field.

"Theater provides the same characteristics that a young person needs: discipline, education, how to put yourself in a community, professionally," he says. "A football player will practice for months in order to have that field goal or that touchdown, and an actor will do 100 hours of rehearsing before they stage a show. It is very much in common. And I think most people don't see that, but I do."

His family relocated to Florida in his teenage years, but after an unhappy stint there, he ended up in Arkansas at 16.

"What can I say? I'm one of those people who prefers mountains to the beach," he says.

There was enough rustic beauty and a burgeoning performing arts scene to keep Insalaco in The Natural State. He immediately started acting in dinner theater, then transitioned to directing through the Arkansas Arts Center (now the Arkansas Museum of Fine Arts), and all by his late teens.

It was through the arts community that he met Sally Riggs. In fact, it was Bill and Judy Trice, parents of Will Trice, the current executive director of the Arkansas Repertory Theatre, who introduced them when they all worked together at the arts center. It was a fateful introduction that would change both of their lives and, by extension, the performing arts landscape of central Arkansas.

Riggs, as Insalaco rightly describes her, is a North Little Rock icon. When she met Insalaco she had just returned home to Arkansas after performing in numerous traveling productions, in "Hello Dolly" on Broadway and as part of the original cast of "Jesus Christ Superstar" on the West End in London.

"When she came home, she was considered one of the best dancers, certainly in the region if not in the country," Insalaco says.

Riggs was supposed to be back home for a short time, but it turned out to be a new chapter instead. She decided to stay, and they made a life together. The two were married for 33 years and had two children. During that time, Riggs opened Studio One for the Performing Arts, sharing her love of dance with thousands of students in central Arkansas.

Insalaco also made a career pivot, but into politics. Putting up yard signs for David Pryor in 1972 led him to become president of the Young Democrats of Arkansas and eventually chairman of the Democratic Party of Arkansas. He also worked for Governor Bill Clinton, and subsequently President Clinton, working in

events. But the shift from the stage to politics wasn't as stark as it seems on the surface.

"It has a great deal of similarities with producing. You're telling stories in theater, and in politics you're putting stories in place, whether it's in a commercial, whether it's at an event or at an arena. It's still a production."

In the 1980s, Insalaco also owned a successful video rental business, supporting independent film by stocking plenty of straight-to-video options before selling in the early 2000s.

The 2000s also brought tragedy. At just 57, Riggs died from renal cell cancer. Insalaco's community rallied around him and encouraged him to find something positive to focus on in the wake of Riggs's death.

"I really wanted to honor her," he says. "Most people who knew us knew I pretty much worshiped her."

Judy Tenenbaum, his faithful friend and fellow theater lover, was there to support him when he decided to return to the stage.

"Judy had really started the whole movement in Argenta. Judy and some others like John Guidan helped make it possible for us to get the building we are in now."

And with that, the Argenta Community Theater was well on its way to becoming an icon itself, complete with a mainstage theater named in honor of Riggs, nestled in the heart of the Argenta Arts District. Papers for the project were filed in 2008, but remodeling the space pushed their official founding dinner to February 2010. President Clinton, Mary Steenburgen and Governor Mike Beebe headlined the gala, hosting nearly 1,300 people in support of ACT.

"It was a remarkable group of people," Insalaco remembers. "It was a magical evening." After an enchanting kickoff, Insalaco wanted to make sure ACT's productions had a promising start as well. The first show was directed by Bob Hupp, then The Rep's producing artistic director. While Hupp encouraged Insalaco to direct the first production, Insalaco remained firm in his vision.

"I was afraid the community at large might think we were trying to open a competitor, and we never wanted to do that," Insalaco says. "We were trying to help the repertory theater."

According to Insalaco, ACT's original "C for Community" mantra was never meant to describe production quality, but instead the theater's connection to local artists and the public.

"What I really wanted was to start a small community theater," he says, "not at a professional level, but one that could train people who could go on to do professional work."

In other words, ACT was designed to strengthen Arkansas' contribution to the art community as a whole.

One contribution that stands out to Insalaco is producing the world premiere of "Mrs. Miniver." The story, originally written for the stage, was first told in William Wyler's 1943 classic film of the same name. Using connections forged during his stint in the video industry and the help of Courtney Pledger, now director of Arkansas PBS, ACT was able to get the rights to "Mrs. Miniver" and present it to the world in 2015.

"It's a remarkable story about the strength of women when men were at war," Insalaco says. "I was glad to be able to put that on stage. It was a highlight of my theatrical career, or certainly one of them."

Yet beyond bringing fresh stories to the stage, Insalaco is most proud of ACT's growing



education program. Christen Pitts, a protégé of Riggs, introduced a dance and education program at ACT. The initial program started with ACTing Up, a two-week summer camp for about 30-40 students. From that promising start, ACT's education program has continued to expand, especially when demand for in-person experiences grew after the pandemic.

Alyson Courtney, who joined the ACT team in June 2022 as the director of development, guided the staff as they added ACT II and the Sharon Heflin Performing Arts Education Center in October of that year. ACT now supports a full-time teaching staff of 12, several contract employees, hundreds of volunteers and impacts 2,500 students annually through year-round programs for all ages.

And it was Courtney who first pushed for ACT to trade Community for Contemporary.

"At first I was against it," Insalaco recalls. "I said, 'Oh, no no no, we can't do that.' And then it became apparent that maybe I'm the past and I need to think about the future."

So Insalaco dusted off his campaign manager hat and polled focus groups to help guide the ACT leadership team as they contemplated a rebrand. The focus groups confirmed Courtney's hunch: It was time for a change. With Insalaco enthusiastically on board, ACT rebranded in March 2024.

"As ACT grew and began to include an expansive education program, we realized that what Tenenbaum and Insalaco created had become so much more than just a community theater," Courtney says of the shift. "We have professional actors, designers and technicians that grace our stage; we have teaching artists that travel in from New York, LA and Chicago to work with our students; and we now reach patrons from all over central Arkansas."

The next chapter looks bright for ACT. As producing artistic director, Insalaco is intentionally setting the foundation for the future, one he hopes will long outlast his tenure. For the 2024-2025 season, Insalaco is focusing on expanding the directorial bench to include nation-wide talent.

The biggest update, however, involves ACT's education program. Through the years, ACT has expanded into three buildings: the main stage, the ACT II educational center and a facility the team calls "the shop" that stores all its sets and supplies. Looking forward, ACT is hoping to expand into a fourth location to support even more education programs.

"We want to have multiple classes going on at one time, all the time, not just in the summer. Those classes will be acting, music and dance for all ages from third grade to adult," Insalaco says. "ACT will really become an academy. That's the only word I can think of. An institution in its own right. I think that's the most exciting thing Argenta can offer central Arkansas."

With support from the city of North Little Rock, Pulaski County and generous sponsors, these expanded offerings will be available to any student who wants to perform.

"No child is ever turned away because of the inability to pay tuition to our classes or camps. We are committed to making our programming accessible to everyone," Courtney says, adding they recently began outreach in schools for students without transportation.

Yet even as ACT expands and redefines its place in central Arkansas, Insalaco is quick to emphasize the collaborative, deeplyrooted sense of community at the heart of ACT productions and programs.

"I don't like to talk about my history," he says. "I'd rather talk about other people's history, because that's what this was about. It wasn't ever about me."

One person's story who Insalaco feels encapsulates the spirit of ACT is technical director Sara Cooke, a former teacher at North Pulaski High School who has spent the last 15 years recruiting fellow retired teachers to paint the sets for ACT shows.

"You can't put that into dollars, you just can't," Insalaco says. "These are 30 professional people, who have mentored thousands of students over their 30-year careers, who now are coming together, eating pizza and designing and creating sets for the shows.

"It's a community of professionals. That's the only way I know how to explain it. I hope that never, ever goes away."



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


